Non-whistle arm

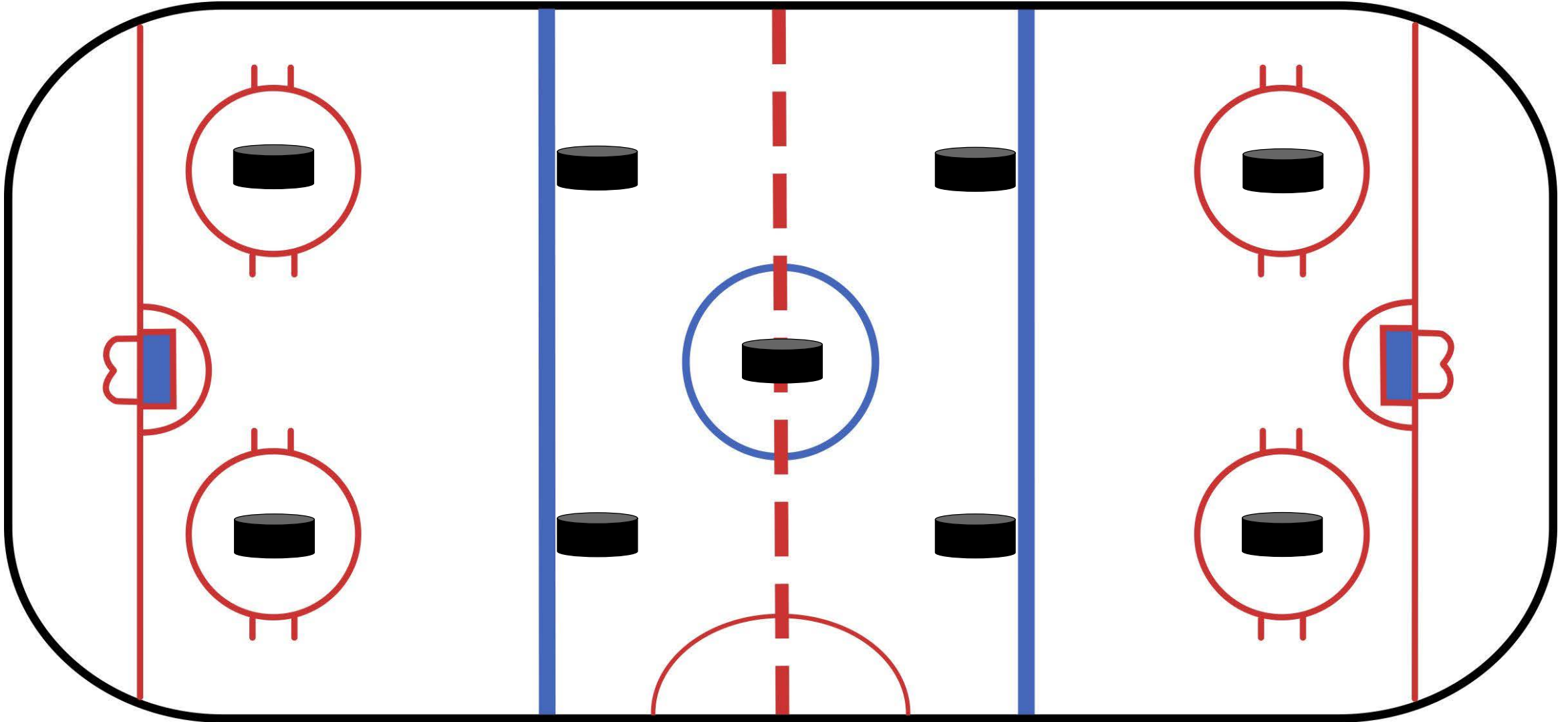


To allow you to blow your whistle for a delayed penalty without having to lower the armband signaling the penalty

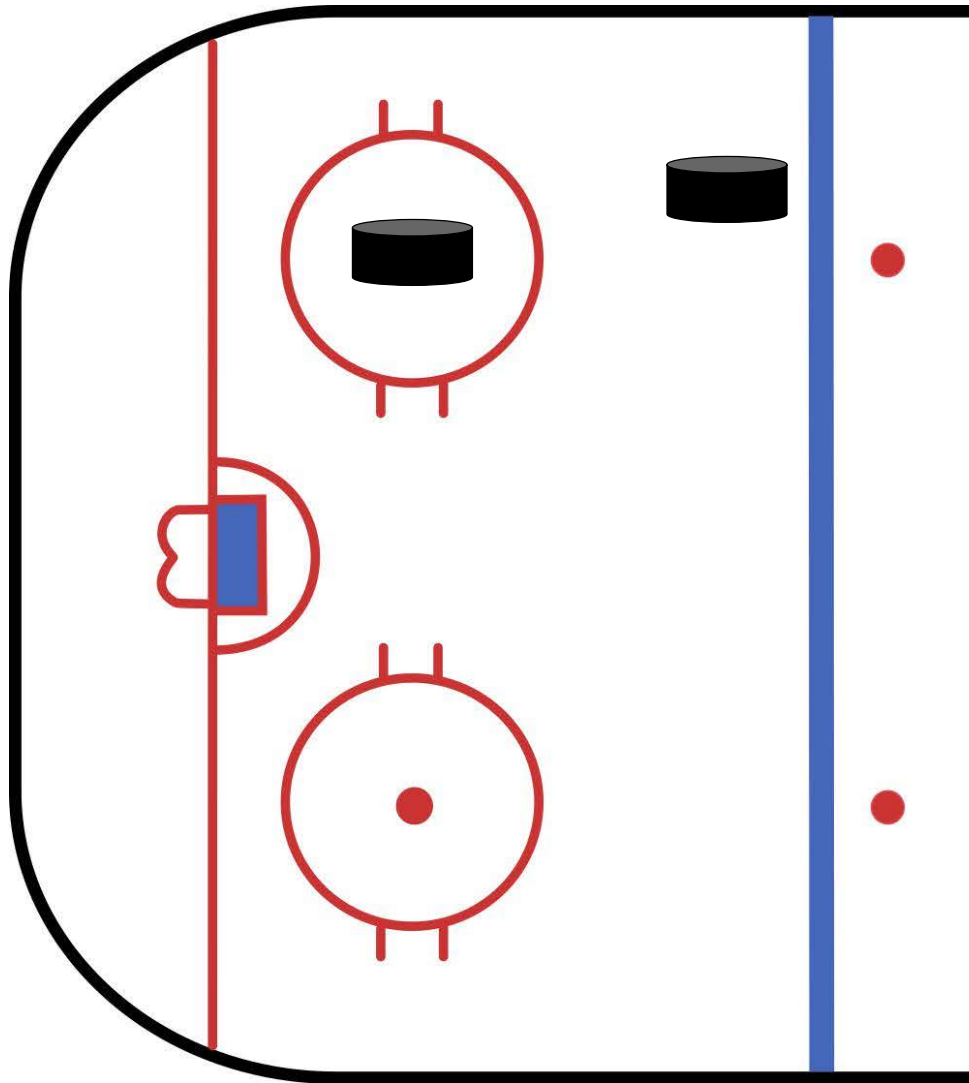




The side of the ice that the puck was shot from or, in the event of an offside, the side closest to where the puck was touched.

Where does the face-off go?

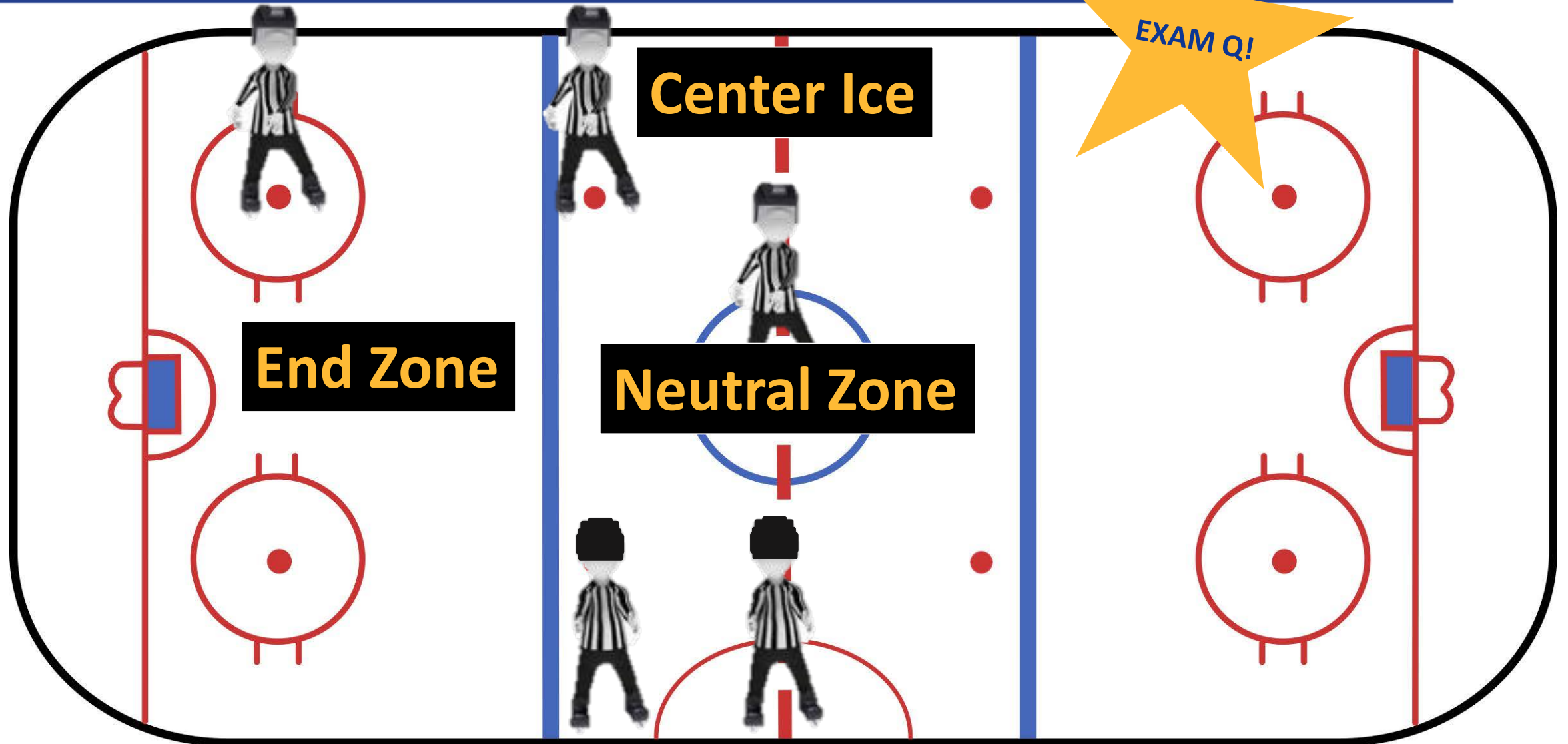


The puck is shot by the defenseman and the goalie covers the puck on the opposite side of the net that the puck was shot from. The referee blows the whistle.

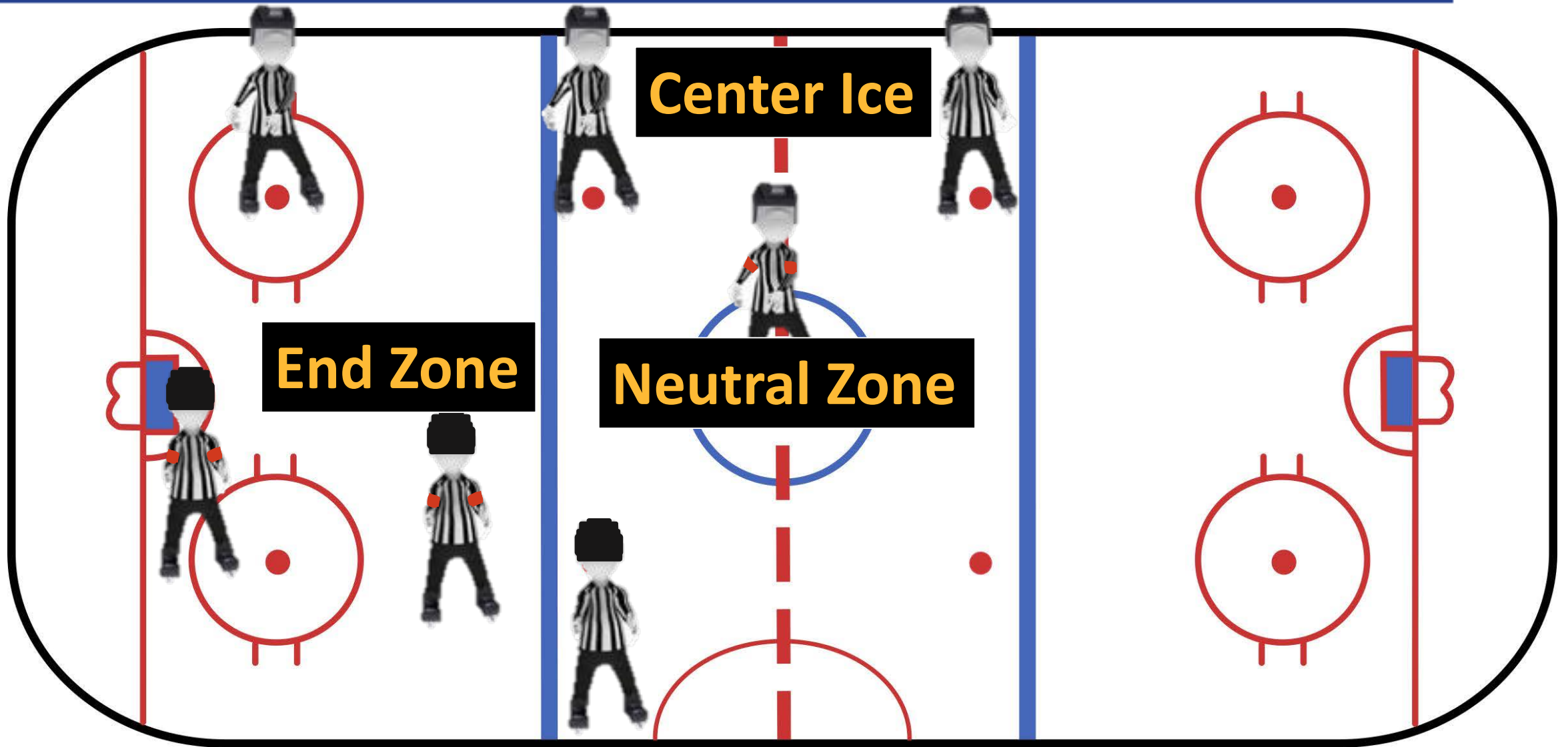

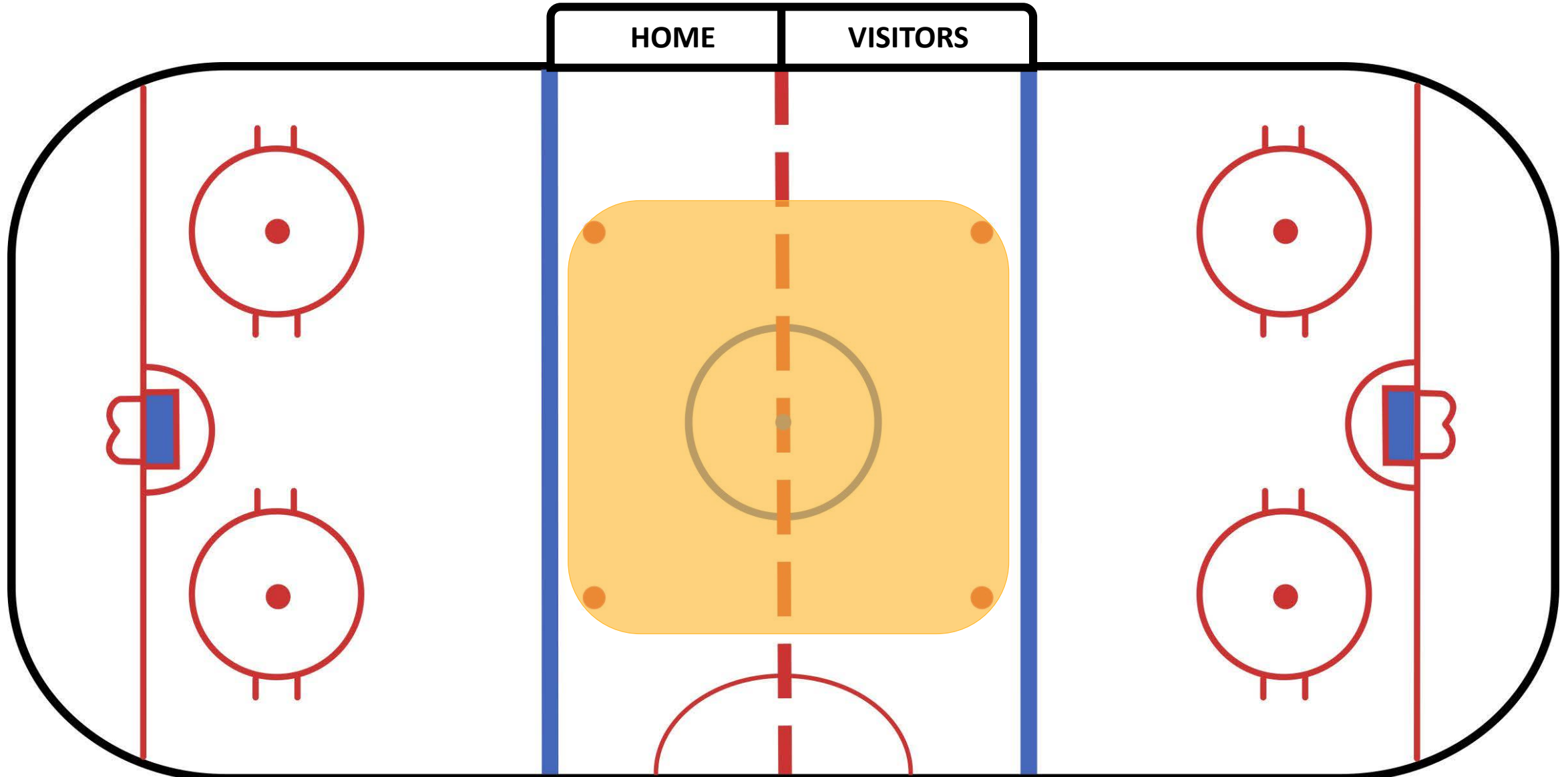

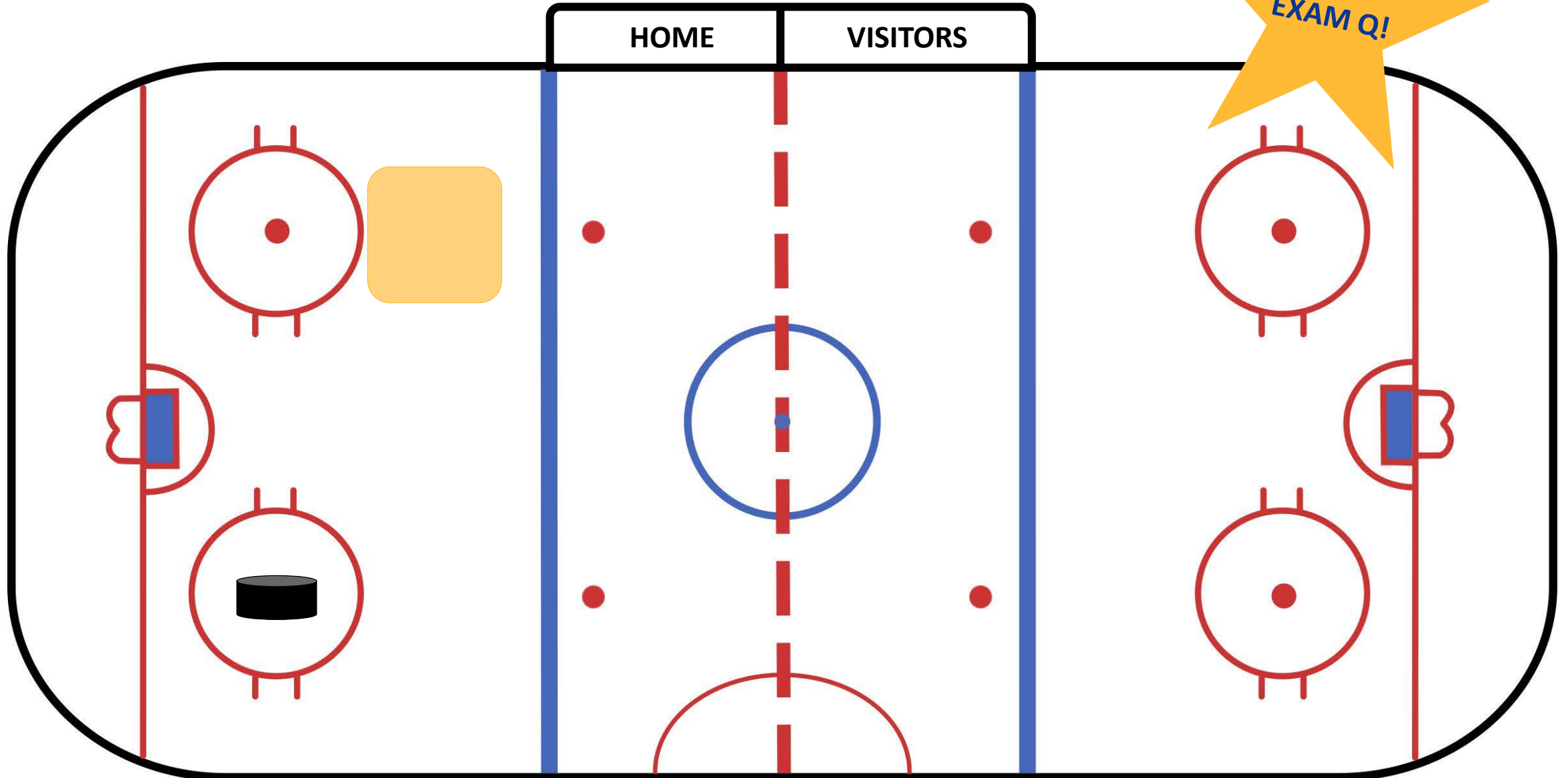

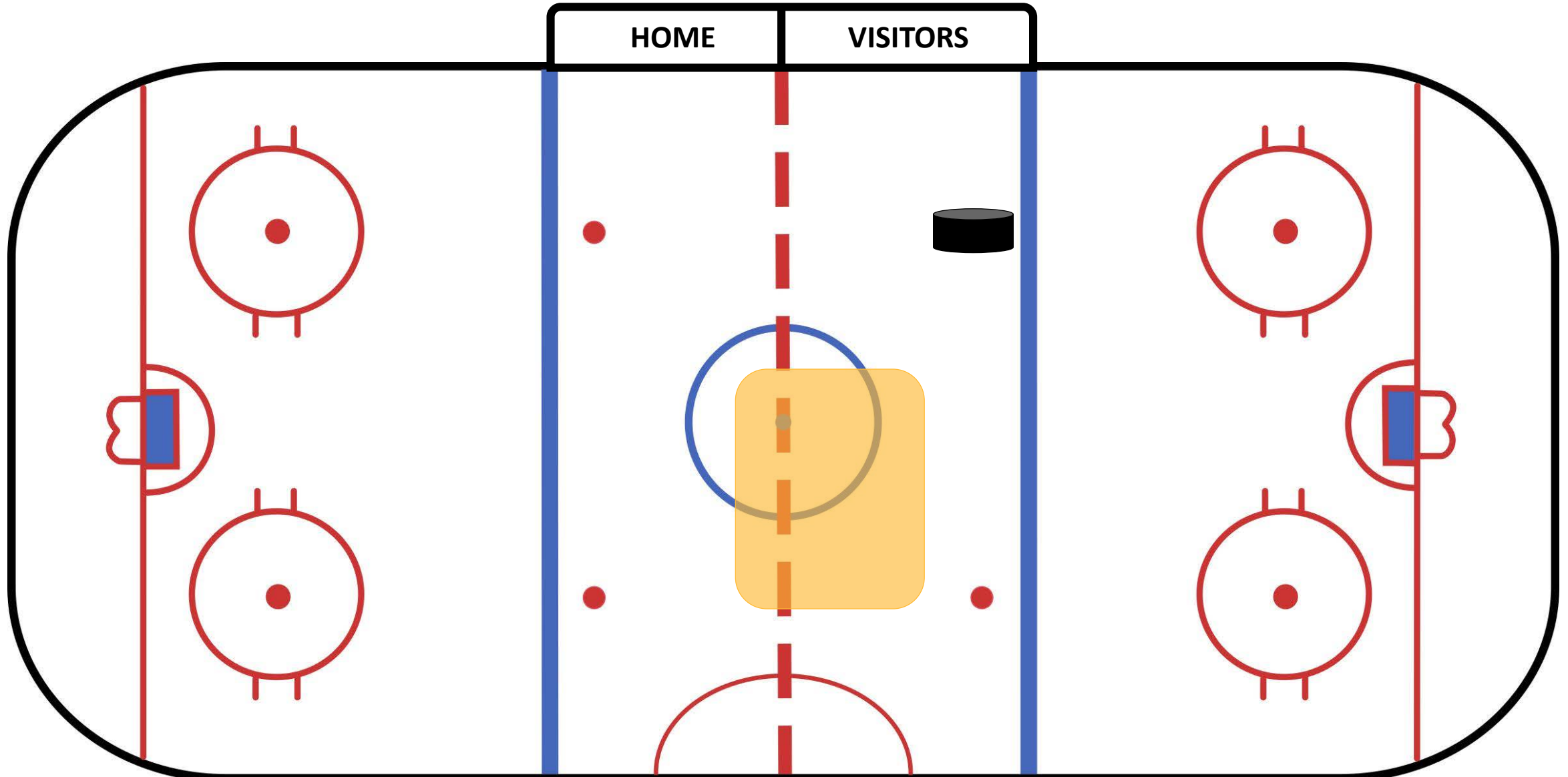
Location for 2-Official System



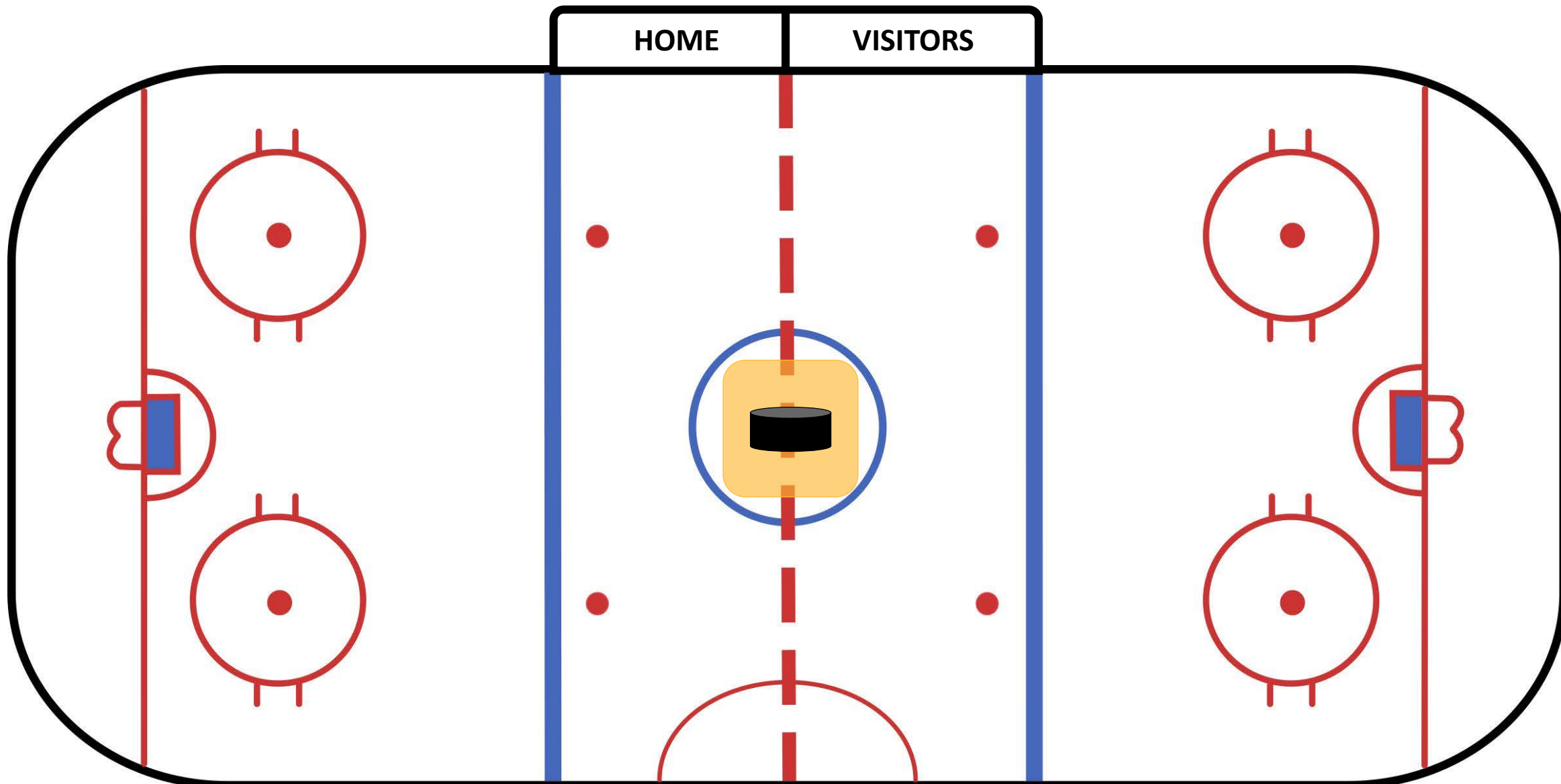
3-Official System: End Zone Face-off

How is the line change procedure done?



1. Go to a location where both benches can see you
2. Look to the visitors bench and give them 5 seconds to change
3. After the 5 seconds, put your arm straight up with your palm facing the visitor's bench indicating that they can no longer change
4. Now face the home team's bench and give them 5 seconds to change
5. After the 5 seconds, put your arm down – both teams can no longer change
6. Go to your position for the face-off

How is the line change procedure done?



For the official dropping the puck, while your partner is doing the line change procedure you:

1. Set-up the players for the face-off
2. Blow your whistle once your partner has completed their line change (puts their hand down)
3. Drop the puck – you have 5 seconds after you blow your whistle to do so

PLAYERS FIRST, PUCK LAST.

After play has been stopped, the officials shall first ensure that no altercations are taking place.

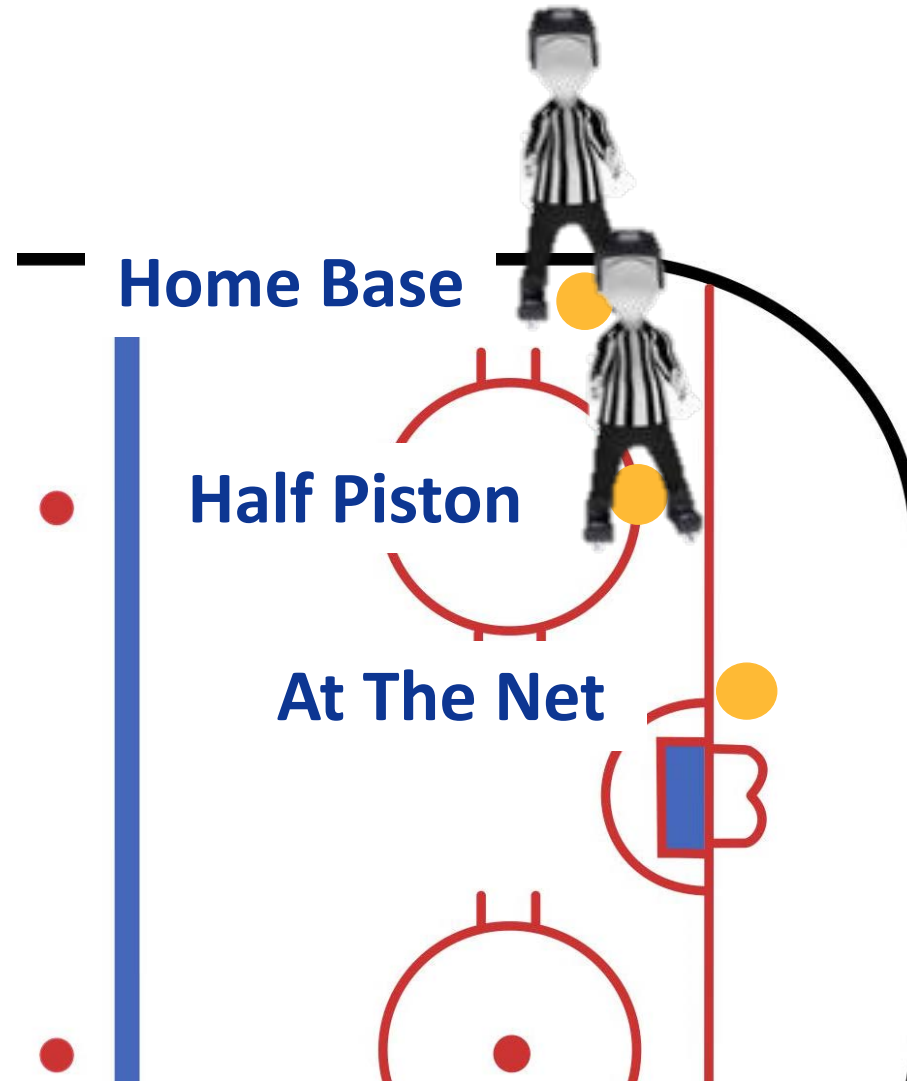
They may retrieve the puck and

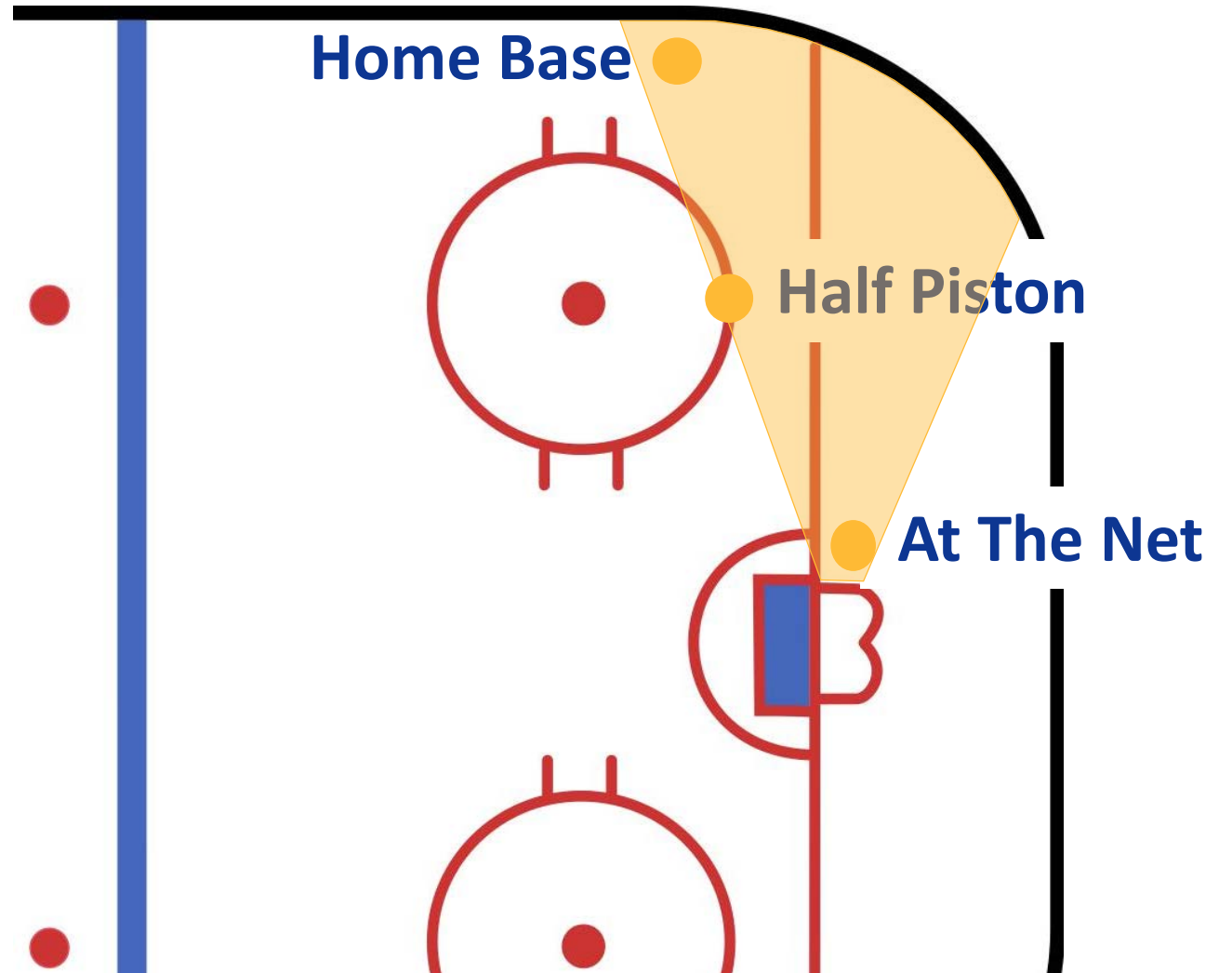
The Cone

Hockey Canada introduced the cone to allow officials to position themselves below the goal line to gain the best sight lines while avoiding being in the play.

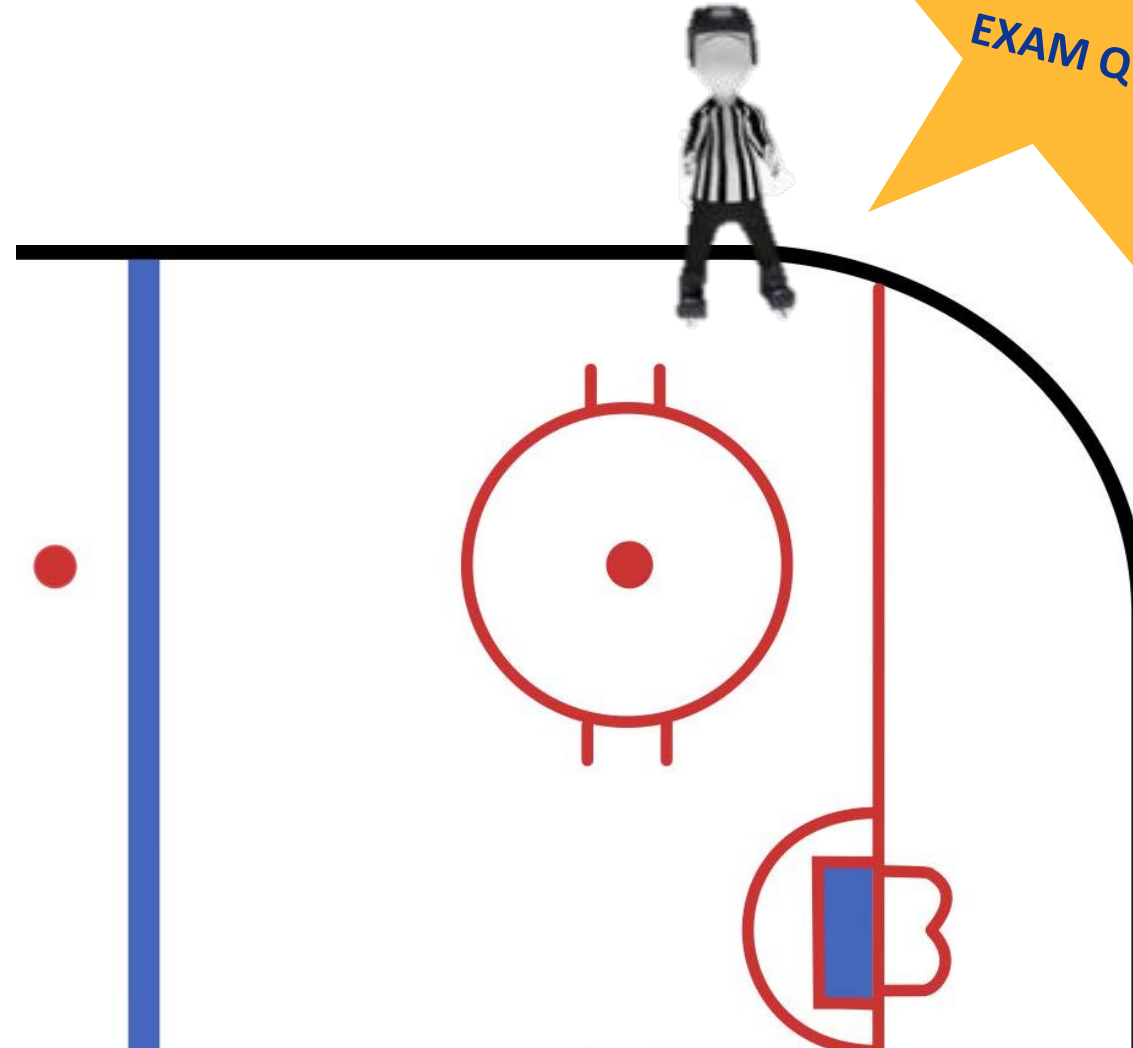
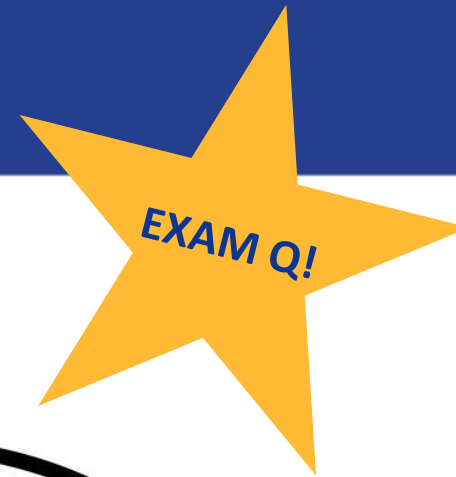
Although the cone area is below the goal line at certain points, it is encouraged that the official stay above it as much as possible returning to the half piston position as soon as possible.

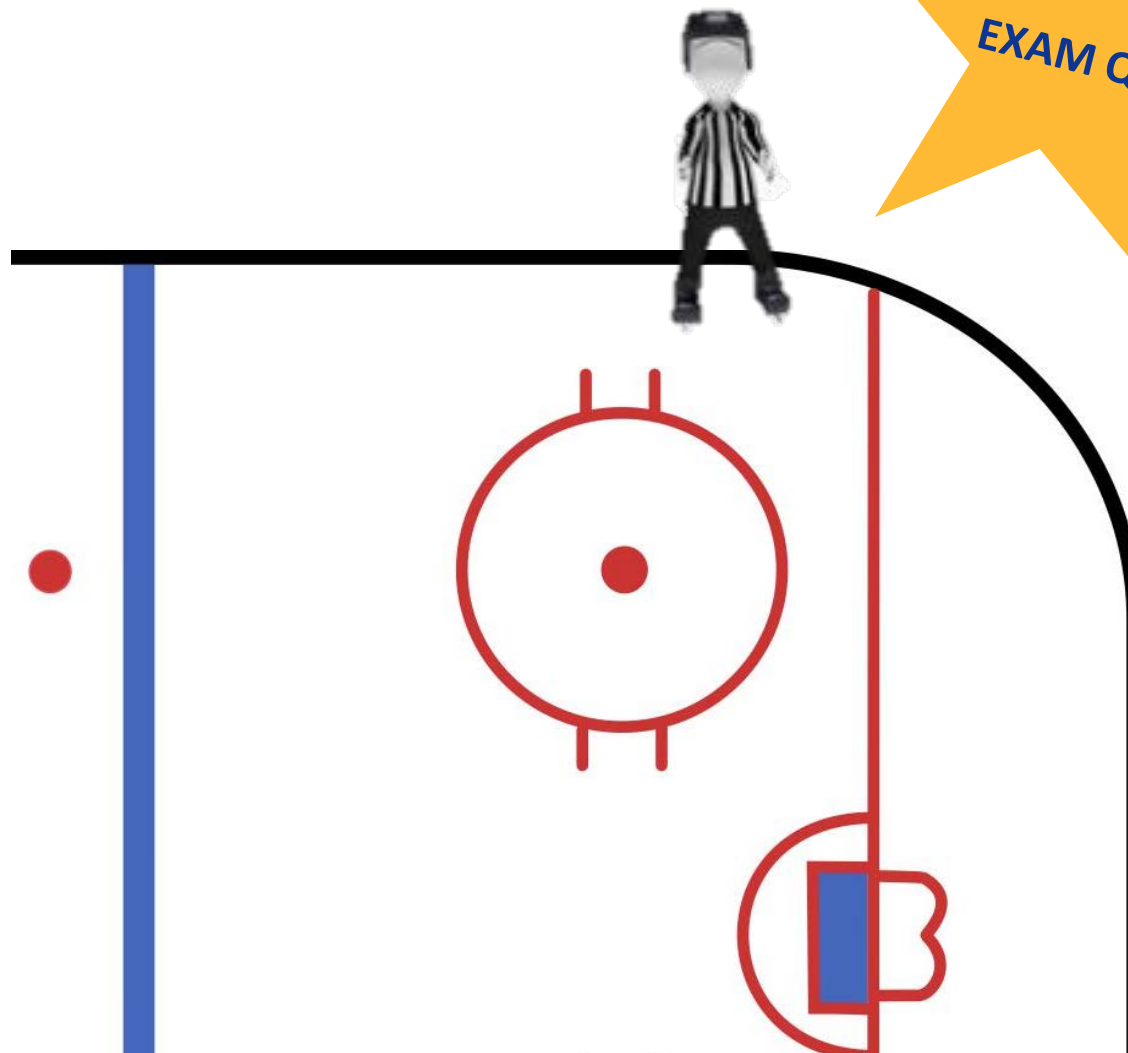

Penalty Procedure

Calling a Penalty



Mentally record the number
and jersey colour of the
offender.

Calling a Penalty



Blow the whistle when the offending team has **possession and control** of the puck.

Calling a Penalty



As the whistle is blown, the referee shall come to a full stop with the signaling arm still fully extended above the head.

Calling a Penalty



The referee will then point out the offending player by lowering a fully extended arm and hand straight out towards the offending player.

Calling a Penalty



The referee shall then verbally call out the offending player's number, team colour and the penalty being assessed (i.e. "14 blue, tripping") and give the correct signal to indicate the infraction.

Calling a Penalty



The referee shall then proceed to the penalty bench, turning to skate backwards, keeping all players in view, and report the infraction.

Calling a Penalty



At the penalty bench the referee shall report the penalized player's number, team colour, the penalty being assessed and the duration, and then give the appropriate signal for the infraction.

Be sure that the timekeeper has all the information before leaving!

Calling a Penalty



The referee will then exit the penalty bench area, avoiding confrontation with the penalized player, and then start the line change procedure.
